## What is God's Forgiveness Like?

# Series on forgiveness (2)

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*Introduction:* What does the word "forgiveness" mean to you?

- A. Those who truly find it will express the same relief that David did. (Psa 51:8-12)
  - 1. All sin is first against God. Our desperate need of this relationship should drive us to Him. (Isa 59:1-2; Psa 51:4)
  - 2. Have you become so hardened that these things do not move you?
- B. As Christians we must continue to see how precious forgiveness is.
  - 1. Have you lost your motivation in the service of the Lord? If so, do you remember the joy of *your* forgiveness? (2 Pt 1:9)
  - 2. It is the humbling but joyful experience of forgiveness that keeps us strong.

#### I. Forgiveness is based on the character of God. (Ex 34:6-7)

- A. What makes God attractive to us? (Psa 36:7, 40:10-11)
  - 1. God's love will provide forgiveness! I am draw to one who cares for me.
  - 2. David knew this and poured out his heart to God. (Psa 51:1)
- B. God's righteousness makes us certain of our forgiveness.
  - 1. His righteousness tells us that we cannot escape the guilt of our sin. (Rom 11:22)
  - 2. Those who play games with sin thinking they "can be forgiven" will pay a heavy price. (**Rom 6:1**)
  - 3. On the other hand God's righteousness tells me He will always keep His word.
- C. Are you aware of the extraordinary lengths God has taken to provide you forgiveness? (Jn 3:16; Mt 26:39)

"If our greatest need had been information, God would have sent us an educator. If our greatest need had been technology, God would have sent us a scientist. If our greatest need had been money, God would have sent us an economist. But since our greatest need was forgiveness, God sent us a Savior." - Author Unknown

### II. Satan's defeat comes through our forgiveness

- A. Satan did not anticipate that God would forgive men!
  - 1. In his role of accuser it appeared that he had won. (Zech 3:1-3)
  - 2. Without forgiveness we are in the hands of Satan. It that what you want?
  - 3. Look at the victory God gives us over Satan! (Zech 3:4-5)
- B. Do you realize the great victory God has given us through the cross? (1 Jn 3:8)
  - 1. Our goal is simple, stay under God's protection and away from Satan.
  - 2. We must be humbled to see our great needs here.
- C. Satan's goal is to cheapen forgiveness so that you do not find it.
  - 1. It is so sad to see the distant stares of the unforgiven. (2 Cor 4:3-4)
  - 2. Satan has convinced many to wait because forgiveness is always there. He has lied about this too.

# III. What is God's forgiveness like?

- A. He blots out our sins! (Acts 3:19; Isa 43:25)
  - 1. God hates sin, but He loves us.
  - 2. If I can live and die in this forgiveness then all is well.
- B. God does not remember our sins any more. (**Heb 8:12**)
  - 1. He is described as casting them into the sea. (Mic 7:18-19)
- "When God buries our sins in the deepest sea, He posts a sign which reads: No Fishing!"
  - 2. When God forgives our sin is long gone! Do you believe this?

- C. God receives us back to a full fellowship. (Lk 15:20-24)
  - 1. There is no grudge holding with God.
  - 2. Our biggest problem is in believing this.

### IV. How can I receive God's forgiveness?

- A. See you sin for what it is. (Rom 3:23; Rom 1:18)
  - 1. It is time to quit making excuses and acknowledge where you are.
  - 2. Satan tries to get you to see sin as righteousness. If you do this you will never change. (Isa 5:20-21; Prov 16:2-7)
  - 3. It may be painful to wake up and see, but consider the blessing that follow!
- B. Meet the conditions of forgiveness.
  - 1. Do not equate the Bible teaching on faith and works with the false conclusion "there is nothing we must do for salvation." God gives an answer to the question "what must I do to be saved."
  - 2. Consider the conditions for one who has never known the Lord.
    - a. Trust in God. (**Jn 8:24**)
    - b. Repentance of sins. (Acts 3:19)
    - c. Confession of Jesus. (Rom 10:9-10)
    - d. Baptism in water. (Acts 2:38)
  - 3. The Christian has conditions for his sins.
    - a. Repent of his sin and pray to God. (Acts 8:22)
    - b. Make this confession a way of life! (1 Jn 1:7-9)

*Conclusion:* Do you know the joy and power of God's forgiveness?

- A. The answer will be evident to all because your actions will show it. (Psa 51:12-13)
  - 1. Attendance for Bible study will not be a problem. This person cannot have enough!
  - 2. Others will be influence because of the words and the zeal of the forgiven.
- B. Do you now know the joy of forgiveness?
  - 1. If not, who has changed, you or God?
  - 2. A hardened heat can be restored. Please do not wait until it is too late.
